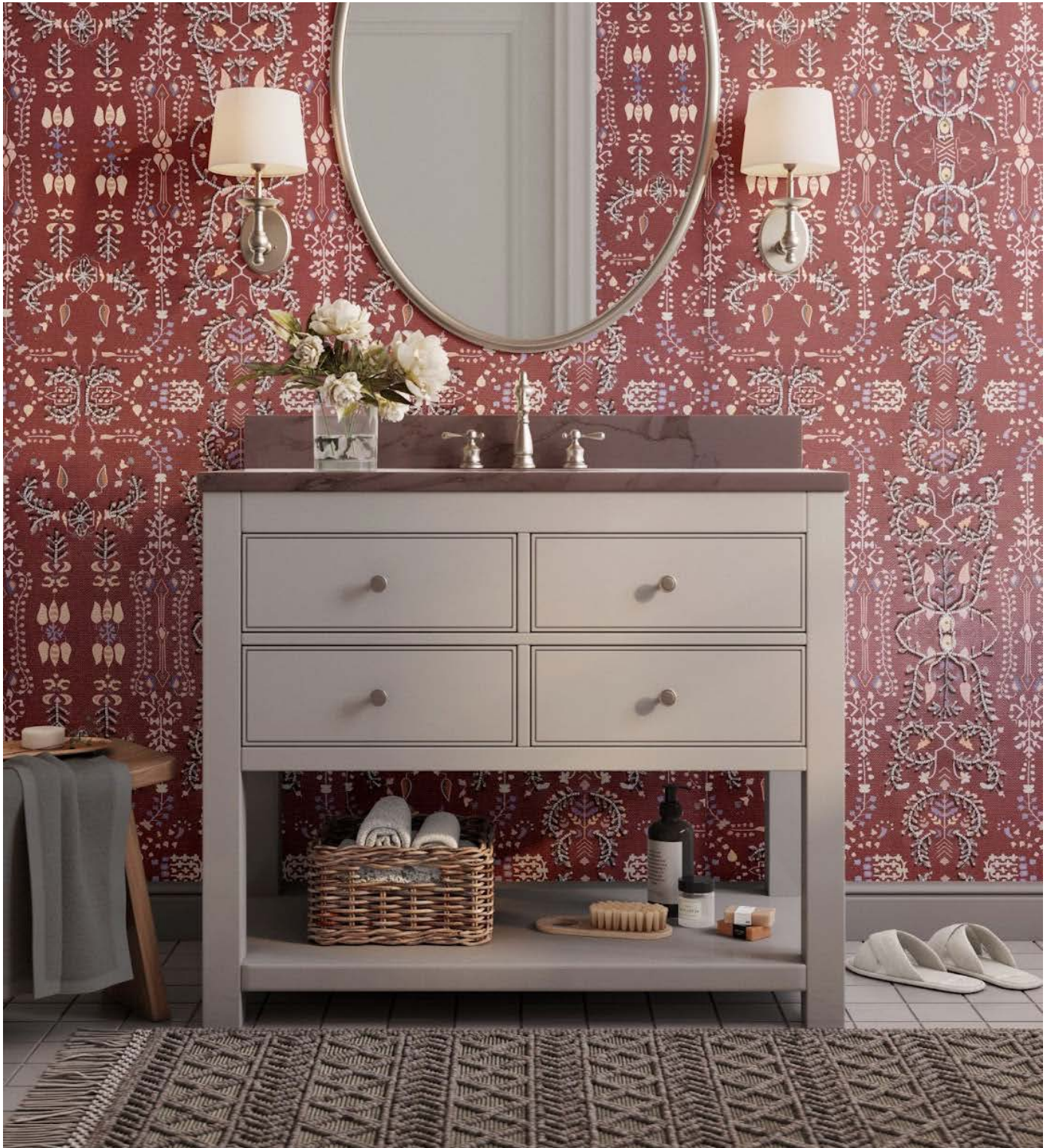
## 2. Biophilic design

## 6. Textured layering

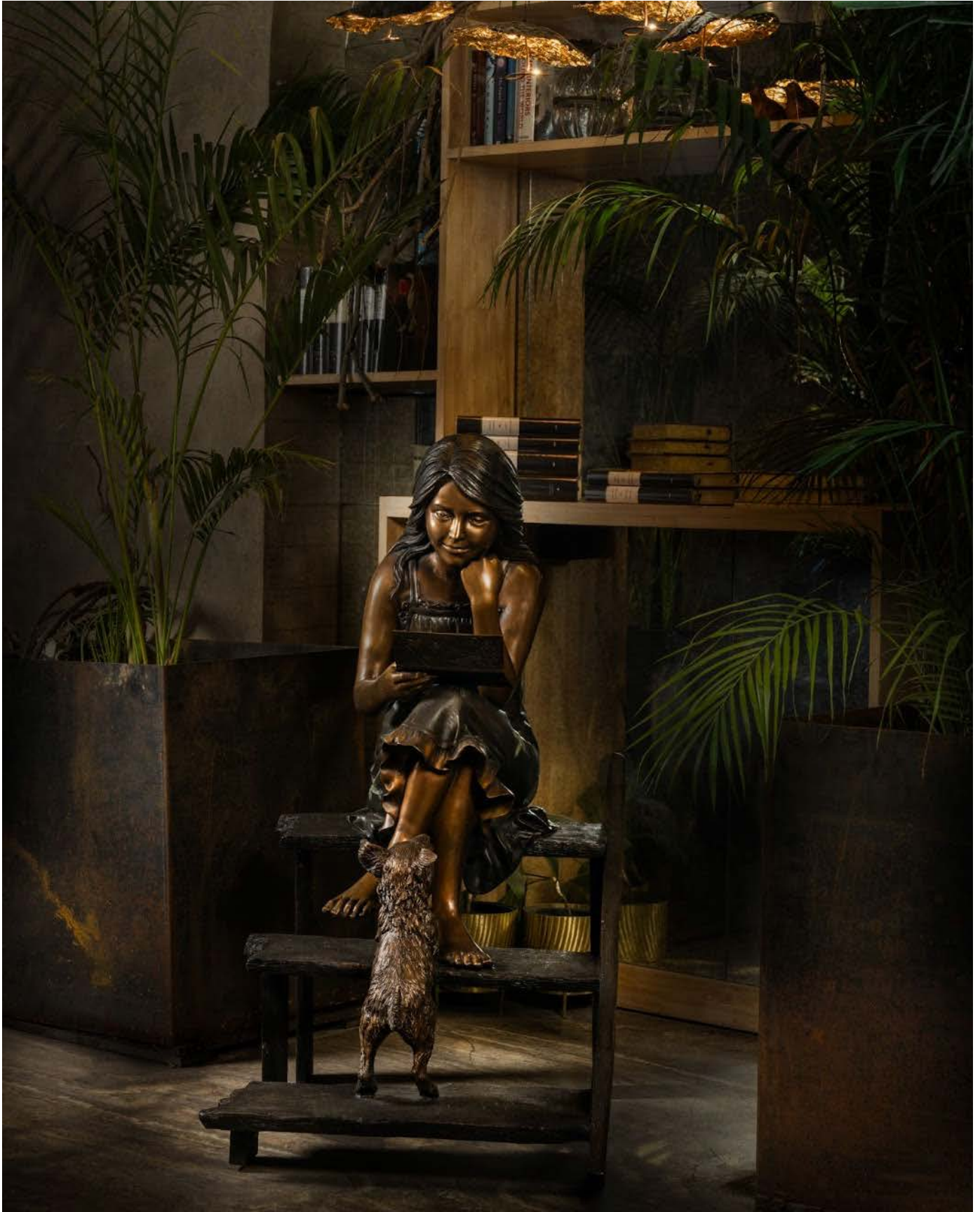
